

Herbs Used as Substitutes for Conventional Drugs

Licorice (*Glycyrrhiza glabra*): Used as anti-inflammatory alternatives to yucca root (*Yucca schidigera*), steroidal, and nonsteroidal drugs

Black walnut (*Juglans nigra*): Used in place of conventional wormers

Wormwood (*Artemisia absinthum*) Used in place of conventional wormers

Saint-Johns-wort (*Hypericum spp.*): Used as a natural substitute for Prozac (fluoxetine HCl)

Oregon grape (*Mahonia spp.*): Used as an antibiotic for eyes, ears, and mucous membranes

Valerian (*Valeriana officinalis*): Used as alternatives to sedative drugs

Skullcap (*Scutellaria laterifolia*): Used as alternatives to sedative drugs

Passionflower (*Passiflora incarnata*): Used as alternatives to sedative drugs

Hop (*Humulus lupulus*): Used as alternatives to sedative drugs

Dandelion leaf (*Taraxacum officinale*): Used in place of furosemide (Lasix)

Senna (*Cassia angustifolia*): Used as a natural laxative
